PLAN REVIEW & INSPECTION FEE POLICY

Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) Permit Application and documentation must be completed and returned to the District Office

If a site will disturb one or more acres of land as defined by clearing, grading, grubbing, excavation, demolition, tree removal, filling and off-site borrow areas, or is part of a larger common plan of development or sale, a SWPPP must be submitted to this office for review and approval prior to disturbance. Please refer to the OEPA/Lawrence County Checklist for SWPPP requirements located on our website at

As part of the SWPPP review process, the following items must be completed:

- O SITE REVIEW FEE: MUST BE PAID AT TIME OF SUBMITAL (SEE FEE SCHEDULE BELOW)
- O LAWRENCE COUNTY EROSION & SEDIMENT CONTROL EARTH MOVING PERMIT APPLICATION.
- o 2 SITE LOCATION MAPS
- 2 FULL SETS OF CONSTRUCTION PLANS MINIMUM OF (24"X36")
- 2 COPIES OF A STORM WATER POLLUTION PREVENTION PLAN (SWP3).
- 1 COPY OF STORM DRAINAGE AND WATER QUALITY CALCULATIONS
- 1 COPY OF A COMPLETED OHIO EPA SWP3 CHECKLIST
- 1 COPY OF YOUR COMPLETED OHIO EPA GENERAL CONSTRUCTION STORM WATER PERMIT NOTICE OF INTENT FORM.
- o 1 COPY OF BMP MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT W/LONG TERM MAINT. PLAN
- DIGITAL COPY OF ALL ITEMS SUBMITTED

FEE SCHEDULE

\$500.00 PER ACRE DISTURBED PLUS

\$2,500.00 which includes the following: Plan Review fees, approval and disapproval letters.

Pre-construction meeting with Contractor, owner, and SWCD representative
6 inspections during the construction

Post Construction – final inspection for close out of the permit

\$200.00- PER INSPECTION FOR ADDITIONAL (ABOVE THE INITIAL 6) TO BE BILLED SEPERATE

^{*} Any project that disturbs one acre or more of ground must obtain permit coverage for storm water discharge. If the project disturbs less than 1 acre but is part of a larger plan of development, a permit is required. *For complete details of the earth moving permit requirement, please see the Storm Water Erosion Control Regulations.

Lawrence County Storm Water Management Program GENERAL SITE PLAN REQUIREMENTS:

- Criteria for the listed documentation must be the same as outlined in the most current Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) National Pollution Discharge Elimination (NPDES) General Storm Water Permit for Construction Activities. Follow the Ohio EPA Construction General Permit OHC000005 SWPPP checklist for specific requirements.
- The reviewer has 30 calendar days to approve or disapprove the permit. If a permit is disapproved, the applicant will receive notification as to the reason for disapproval and has to submit a revised plan. One copy of the approved SWPPP Plan will be returned to the applicant.
- The approve SWPPP will be valid for 2 years.
- The developer must apply for a Notice of Intent (NOI) from Ohio EPA. A copy of the NOI, OEPA approval letter and facility number must be submitted as part of the SWPPP.
- All fees must be paid PRIOR to the start of construction.
- An approved SWPPP and pre-construction meeting is required before earth moving commences.
- The applicant must also follow all Local, State, and Federal Regulations.

MINIMUM STANDARDS – The Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) must address all minimum components of the most recent NPDES Construction General Permit for Ohio and Lawrence County Stormwater Management Erosion & Sediment Control Regulations, Ordinance Chapter 941.



STORMWATER POLLUTION PREVENTION PLAN (SWPPP)

Follow OEPA Construction General Permit OHC000005 Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan Checklist

These requirements apply to all activities involving land disturbance of one acre or more with the exception of agricultural activities. Applicable activities include but are not limited to grading, vegetation clearing, soil compaction, paving, repaving and Linear Underground/overhead Projects (LUPs). Prior to the County issuing a permit for such activities-including grading, building, demolition or other types of land disturbance—each operator must prepare and submit a SWPPP to the County in accordance with the requirements of the Construction General Permit. The OEPA checklist is used to conduct and document the County's review of the SWPPP as required by the County's MS4 NPDES Permit.
